




Covenant

- You always have permission to "pass."




BART EHRMAN

- * Trace how some early forms of Christianity were suppressed, reformed, or forgotten.




CANONIZATION




FORGED?



- ** Leading authority on the New Testament and the history of early Christianity.






BRUCE METZGER (1914 - 2007)

- * Doktorvater
- Emeritus professor of New Testament language and literature at Princeton Theological Seminary (taught for 40 years)




BRUCE METZGER (1914 - 2007)

- * Ordained Presbyterian minister
- ** World-renowned authority on translating the New Testament from the original Greek.
- Supervised the New Revised Standard Version of the Bible (NRSV)



THESIS

- Early Christianity was diverse not monolithic
- * "Heretics" vs. *Proto*-orthodox
- Heretic (from Greek αἵρεσις, meaning "choice")
- ****** ortho-



HISTORY WRITTEN BY THE VICTORS

- Proto-orthodox some beliefs and texts were valorized, canonized, and included in the NT.
- <u>Heresies</u> other beliefs and texts were denigrated, rejected, attacked, suppressed, and destroyed.






GOALS

- Explore the diversity of noncanonical scriptures. (Outside the "official" circle)
- Examine variety of Christian faith and practice in the 2nd and 3rd centuries. [1st century timeline]
- * Trace the rise of the proto-orthodox: how one (among many) became dominant


** Beginning with seven of Paul's letters illustrates that there were vibrant Christian communities spread throughout the Roman Empire before there were written Gospels.




* Placing the Gospels after Paul makes it clear that as written documents they are not the source of early Christianity but its product. (The "good news" preceded the written Gospels.) They are the products of early Christian communities several decades after Jesus' historical life.




** Reading the Gospels in chronological order beginning with Mark demonstrates that early Christian understandings of Jesus and his significance developed. (Matthew and Luke used Mark as a source, adding and modifying.)



** Seeing John separated from the other Gospels and relatively late in the New Testament makes it clear how different his Gospel is from the "synoptics."



Realizing that many of the documents are from the late first and early second centuries allows us to glimpse developments in early Christianity in its third and fourth generations.

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CHRISTIANITY OR CHRISTIANITIES?

MANY OF THESE CONTEMPORARY GROUPS DON'T CONSIDER THE OTHERS "CHRISTIAN"

WHAT COULD BE MORE DIVERSE?

- * How many God(s)? (1, 2, 30, 365?)
- * Who created the world? (God or subordinate deity?)
- * Was creation a cosmic mistake?
- * Who was Jesus? (Divine or Human?)
- ** What did Jesus' death mean? (The salvation of the world or, "What? Jesus died?")

WHAT COULD BE MORE DIVERSE?

- * Contemporary difference pale in comparison
- * Most of those ancient groups unknown today because reformed or eliminated
- * How could these group be "Christian" (<u>Remember</u>: these was no "canon")
- ** Diverse Genres [LS ToC] ***

COUNCIL OF NICEA (325CE)


* "Virtually all forms of modern Christianity, where they acknowledge it or not, go back to one form of Christianity that emerged as victorious from the conflicts of the second and third centuries" (LC 4).

* "I shall tell you of William Wallace. Historians from England will say I am a liar, but history is written by those who have hanged heroes."





CHAPTER 1

The Ancient Discovery of a Forgery: Serapion & the Gospel of Peter

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* 'Ancient Christians knew of far more Gospels than the four that eventually came to be included in the New Testament. Most of them have been lost to us in all but name. Some are quoted sporadically by early church writers who opposed them. A few have been discovered in modern times" (13).

- * "The Church has four gospels.... The heretics have many." ("Homily on Luke 1")





EUSEBIUS (260/265 - 339/340)


- * 10 volume Church History
- Eusebius' quotations are the only source for many 2nd and 3rd century texts...even though he was biased (pro-Constantine)



SERAPION


BECAME BISHOP OF ANTIOCH (IN SYRIA) IN 199 CE

* Allowed the use of the Gospel of Peter (but hadn't read it too closely)...trusted that if Peter wrote it, the book must be good/authoritative.



DOCETISM

- ** Accusation against Gospel of Peter. (Serapion condemned after read it.)
- * Greek δοκεῖν/δόκησις ("to seem").
 - Really divine...only seemed human
 - Didn't really suffer.



DOCETISM

Mark 1:10, "And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him." [Adoptionism]

Mark 15:34, At three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?" which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" [divine left]
[LS 33 v. 18, "My power..."]




THE GOSPEL OF PETER

- * Arguably at least as popular as the canonical Mark (3 times as many surviving mss) ***
- * Continuing Popularity ***
- * Scenes [LS 33 v. 39-44]
 Resurrection
 Angels help
 Giant Jesus
 Cross talk
- * (Although these scenes may strike us as unbelievably odd, that may be do principally to their unfamiliarity. Are they really that different in kind from the most familiar but still fantastical claims found in the canonical scriptures?)

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THE GOSPEL OF PETER

- ** Ancient Discovery (by Serapion)
 of a Forgery (not by the
 "historical" Peter) [LS 34 v. 60]
- * (Historical) Peter executed under Nero's persecutions c. 64
- Gospel of Peter (early 2nd c.)...Modern Rediscovery***



THE GOSPEL OF PETER

- * Trend:
 - * Exculpating Pilate/Rome (not "Pilot")
 - ** Blaming Jews***
