


## November 30<sup>th</sup>, 9:15 and 11:15 : Bhante Sujatha

This is my first message in the *Unison* as president of the Board of Trustees (BoT). I am very happy to be your president for the next two years. Please feel free to contact me about UUCF (questions, concerns, or ideas), either by phone (301-865-5975) or by email ([phagebob4@gmail.com](mailto:phagebob4@gmail.com)).

Things are going well at UUCF. Attendance is good at both the early and late Sunday services (thanks to Thia Wood for numbers). The finance committee reports that giving is on schedule and that there have been some special gifts (thanks to Janice Schlepp and the finance committee). The long-term plans are proceeding as per design (thanks to Steve Schatken and the Comprehensive Planning Committee). We did a short dance with Kol Ami about changing our arrangement with them, but there probably will be no change in the short run.

Our most important item is that Rev. Carl Gregg has been admitted to preliminary fellowship with the UUA. When Rev. Carl was hired by UUCF in 2012, he had just begun the process of coming into fellowship with UUA, a process that requires at least 5 years. Given our bylaws and UUA policies, the search committee and BoT of 2012 decided that it would be best to hire Rev. Carl as a contract employee of the BoT for two years or until he came into fellowship with UUA and could be called. We told him that we could not call him until he was admitted to fellowship and strongly encouraged him to work on coming into fellowship.

The current BoT thinks that Rev. Carl has performed a superb job at UUCF and that we want to move on to building the UUCF community to be larger, stronger, and more involved in life. We think that calling Rev. Carl is the proper next step. The UUCF will vote on this issue on 2 November. This is an important decision for UUCF and we need your vote. If at all possible, please stay for the Congregational Meeting on 2 November, else cast an absentee ballot.

**Did you know?**

In September, our expenses exceeded our income by \$7,994.44. Our Income remained about the same as August, while our facilities expense increased because of the water damage repairs. We will be reimbursed from the Insurance Company in October.

Our available cash in the General (Operating) Fund is \$73,317.96 as of September 30, 2014.

The painting and repairs on the outside of the building have been completed, leaving a balance in the Capital Reserve Fund of \$30,463.33. Thank you to Stan Schlepp for staying on top of the job and getting the best possible job at the lowest cost.

Our mortgage continues to decrease by about \$2K per month and we now owe \$1,015,506.58 on the building. Next step, get it below a million! And then who knows...

## Board of Trustees Notes

Since Rev. Carl Gregg was admitted to preliminary fellowship with the UUA last month, the Board moved ahead to schedule a Congregational Meeting for November 2 for the purpose of calling Carl as our "settled" minister, it being our assumption that this was the planned endpoint of the search process. The Congregational Conversation that was held on October 19 was envisioned by the Board as a time for people to get clarity on what "calling" Rev. Carl means. Questions were answered, and a discussion was held on the advantages/disadvantages of calling a minister over a contract relationship.

At the meeting in October, the Board continued its work of following up on actions recommended by the Strategic Plan, accepted good news from the Treasurer (UUCF is on target with 25% of expenditures and income), and made plans for business for future Board meetings. Some time was spent discussing an inquiry from Kol Ami about increasing their use of space of UUCF and whether that space might be provided by a modular unit. Since the Board meeting, Kol Ami decided to look elsewhere, so further exploration is unnecessary. However, it is hoped that the two congregations can find additional ways to collaborate.

Highlights of the Minister's report to the Board included: approval for a fund raiser for Project Bona Fide as part of our commitment to Green Sanctuary; new information on the UUCF website about our connections to the larger UU world ([frederickuu.org/connect](http://frederickuu.org/connect)); annual reviews of personnel; congratulations to SAC and Phyllis Liddell on the book sale; changing CLC staff meetings to a time when Sue Singley can attend; scheduling of UUCF 201: Pathways to Leadership for Nov. 9, 12:15 PM; and information on a possible parish nurse and congregational health program. Board members are very appreciative of Carl's attention to detail and sensitivity to new opportunities that this list represents.
