LANDSCAPING NEEDS YOUR SUPPORT

Our church needs twelve volunteers to spend two hours per week between March and November maintaining our landscape of five acres. If we include mowing as we did until this year, this will add eight hours per week about twenty times between the third week of May and the first week of November. There is no more money for mowing.

Dick Menzer will be away from September 17th to 26th, and October 15th to 23rd. He has spent ten or more hours per week from March through September planting, weeding, fertilizing, pruning and watering. The drought has cost us about 20 of the 70 plants put in during the spring. More will be lost if the watering is not maintained on 10 percent of the 600 plants added in the past seven years.

Fiscal Matters

OUCH!!!

What's the problem, you ask? It's the pain caused by our August electric bill: \$1900 for one month's electric usage -- more than double the amount of any bill we have ever gotten in the summer months. Even though we pay for electricity on a fixed rate contract through an electric cooperative, we really got socked in August. It's because our daily power usage on that bill was 400 KWH per day, compared to about 250 per day in other summers.

Yes, I know we had lots of 90 degree days this year, but on some of those days, doors were left open while the AC was running, or the AC was running in rooms that were empty, or lights were left on all night long. Please, please, please -- help us conserve -- especially when it is really hot or really cold. No matter the weather, we can be more careful of how we use both our natural resources and our financial resources.

WHAT IS THE "UUCF WISH LIST"? HOW DO I MAKE A CONTRIBUTION?

At the Congregation's Annual Meeting on June 13, UUCF members approved our financial plan for the new UUCF church year that began on July 1. The plan has two parts. First is the "status quo" budget. It takes care of all regular salary, building and program costs; these are the things you pay for through pledges, fund-raising projects, etc. Second, members adopted a "wish list" of improvements we would like to make, all of which will require new donations. Here are the items on the Wish List:

- -- a mowing service to keep our grounds trimmed on a year-round schedule.
- -- paying the full amount of our annual dues to UUA and JPD (the status quo budget will pay for part of the dues, but we wish to pay them all!)
- -- donations targeted to our Capital Reserve Fund, i.e., the money we use for major repairs of the building

People have inquired how to make a donation to the Wish List. Remember, these will be donations over and above your regular pledge. You can write a check or submit a "Wish List Pledge". Pledges should be in writing, telling the Treasurer how much you plan to donate to the Wish List and when you will make payments. If you can write a check to UUCF, add the note "Wish List" on the memo line.

Yes, you may designate your donation to just one of the Wish List items. Be sure to tell us your intention by making a note on your check or supplementary pledge.
